Seabiscuit (May 23, 1933 – May 17, 1947) was a champion thoroughbred racehorse in the United States who became the top money-winning racehorse up to the

Seabiscuit (May 23, 1933 – May 17, 1947) was a champion thoroughbred racehorse in the United States who became the top money-winning racehorse up to the 1940s. He beat the 1937 Triple Crown winner, War Admiral, by four lengths in a two-horse special at Pimlico and was voted American Horse of the Year for 1938.

A small horse, at 15.2 hands high, Seabiscuit had an inauspicious start to his racing career, winning only a quarter of his first 40 races, but became an unlikely champion and a symbol of hope to many Americans during the Great Depression.

Seabiscuit has been the subject of numerous books and films, including *Seabiscuit: the Lost Documentary* (1939); the Shirley Temple film *The Story of Seabiscuit* (1949); a book, *Seabiscuit: An American Legend* (1999) by Laura Hillenbrand; and a film adaptation of Hillenbrand's book, *Seabiscuit* (2003), that was nominated for the Academy Award for Best Picture. There is also a street in Indian Trail, North Carolina named after him.

Although Sea Sovereign achieved moderate success as a racehorse, he is most famous for being part of the line sired by Seabiscuit. The fine lines of Sea Sovereign's posture, along with his light-bay coloring, resulted in the horse appearing in the 1949 Shirley Temple film to portray his sire, *The Story of Seabiscuit*.

Tobias Vincent Maguire (born June 27, 1975) is an American actor and film producer. He is best known for starring as the title character in Sam Raimi's Spider-Man trilogy (2002–2007), a role he later reprised in Spider-Man: No Way Home (2021).

Maguire was born in Los Angeles and began his career in supporting roles, before gaining international recognition and critical praise for his role as Spider-Man in the 2002 film of the same name. He reprised the role in two sequels, Spider-Man 2 (2004) and Spider-Man 3 (2007). Maguire expanded his career with dramatic roles in Seabiscuit (2003), The Good German (2006), and The Great Gatsby (2013). He received critical acclaim and a Golden Globe Award nomination for Best Actor in a Motion Picture Drama for his role as a PTSD-stricken soldier in the war film Brothers (2009).

Outside of acting, Maguire has also produced several films, including 25th Hour (2002) and Seabiscuit. He later established his own production company, Material Pictures, in 2012 and co-produced Good People (2012), Pawn Sacrifice (2014), and Babylon (2022).

War Admiral (May 2, 1934 – October 30, 1959) was a champion American Thoroughbred racehorse and the fourth winner of the American Triple Crown. He was also the 1937 Horse of the Year and well known as the rival of Seabiscuit in the "Match Race of the Century" in 1938. War Admiral won 21 of his 26 starts with earnings of \$273,240 and was the leading sire in North America for 1945. He was also an outstanding broodmare sire whose influence is still felt today in descendants such as Triple Crown winners American Pharoah and Justify.

Seabiscuit Handicap

The Seabiscuit Handicap is a Grade II American Thoroughbred horse race for three-years-old and older over a distance of one and one-sixteenth miles (8+1⁄2

George Monroe Woolf (May 31, 1910 – January 4, 1946), nicknamed "The Iceman", was a Canadian thoroughbred race horse jockey. An annual jockey's award given by the United States Jockeys' Guild is named in his honor. He became known for riding the people's champion Seabiscuit to victories in 1938.

After his early death resulting from a racing accident, Woolf was inducted into newly founded honorary institutions: the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame, Canada's Sports Hall of Fame and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

Elizabeth Irene Banks (née Mitchell; February 10, 1974) is an American actress, comedian, director, and producer. She is known for playing chaperone Effie Trinket in *The Hunger Games* film series (2012–2015) and an ICCA commentator in the *Pitch Perfect* film series (2012–2017). She made her directorial film debut with *Pitch Perfect 2* (2015), whose \$69 million opening-weekend gross set a record for a first-time director. She directed the action comedy *Charlie's Angels* (2019) and the horror comedy film *Cocaine Bear* (2023). Banks founded the film and television production company Brownstone Productions in 2002 with her husband, Max Handelman.

Banks made her film debut in the low-budget independent film *Surrender Dorothy* (1998). She has appeared in films such as *Wet Hot American Summer* (2001), Sam Raimi's *Spider-Man* trilogy (2002–2007), *Seabiscuit* (2003), *The 40-Year-Old Virgin* (2005), *Slither* (2006), *Invincible* (2006), *Zack and Miri Make a Porno* (2008), *Role Models* (2008), *The Next Three Days* (2010), *Man on a Ledge* (2012), *What to Expect When You're Expecting* (2012), "Pitch Perfect" (franchise) *Movie 43* (2013), *The Lego Movie* film series (2014–2019), *Love & Mercy* (2014), *Walk of Shame* (2014), *Magic Mike XXL* (2015), *Power Rangers* (2017), *Brightburn* (2019), *Call Jane* (2022), *Migration* (2023), and *Skincare* (2024).

On television, Banks had a recurring role as Avery Jessup on the NBC sitcom *30 Rock* (2010–2012), which earned her two Primetime Emmy Award nominations. She had recurring roles on the comedy series *Scrubs* (2006–2009) and *Modern Family* (2009–2020), the latter of which earned her a third Primetime Emmy Award nomination. She also starred in the Netflix miniseries *Wet Hot American Summer: First Day of Camp* (2015) and *Wet Hot American Summer: Ten Years Later* (2017). Since 2019, Banks has hosted the ABC revival of the game show *Press Your Luck*.
