Glenn Aimee Headly (March 13, 1955 – June 8, 2017) was an American actress. She was widely known for her roles in Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, Dick Tracy, and Mr. Holland's Opus. Headly received a Theatre World Award and four Joseph Jefferson Awards and was nominated for two Primetime Emmy Awards.

In 2017, Headly appeared in two films, The Circle and Just Getting Started. The latter marked her final film role, released six months after her death. She also starred in Hulu's comedy series Future Man. She died on June 8, 2017, mid-way through filming the series.

Macaulay Macaulay Culkin Culkin (born Macaulay Carson Culkin; August 26, 1980 (1980-08-26)) is an American actor and musician. Considered one of the most successful child actors of the 1990s, Culkin has received a Golden Globe Award nomination and other accolades. In 2005, he was ranked second on VH1's list of the "100 Greatest Kid-Stars". In 2023, he received a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

Culkin earned recognition for playing Kevin McCallister in the Christmas comedy Home Alone (1990), and reprised the role in Home Alone 2: Lost in New York (1992). He furthered his success with the coming-of-age film My Girl (1991), the psychological thriller film The Good Son (1993), and the comedy films Getting Even with Dad and Richie Rich (both 1994). He took a hiatus starting in 1995, and returned to acting with the biographical drama film Party Monster (2003). Culkin appeared in the independent films Saved! (2004) and Sex and Breakfast (2007), and two projects by Adam Green: The Wrong Ferarri (2011) and Adam Green's Aladdin (2016). He starred in the comedy film Changeland (2019) and the tenth season of the anthology series American Horror Story (2021), and had a voice role in Kid Cudi's television special

Entergalactic (2022).

Culkin wrote the autobiography *Junior* (2006), which describes his experiences with stardom and relationship with his father. From 2013 to 2016, he was a member of the comedy rock band the Pizza Underground, serving as the lead vocalist. In 2018, Culkin became the publisher and CEO of Bunny Ears, a satirical popular culture website and podcast.

Judd Nelson

Judd Asher Nelson (born November 28, 1959) is an American actor. After a lead role in the film *Making the Grade* (1984), Nelson had his breakout with a starring role in the coming-of-age teen film *The Breakfast Club* (1985), which caused him to be associated with a group of actors known as the "Brat Pack."

In the late 1980s, Nelson starred in the Brat Pack films *St. Elmo's Fire* (1985) and *Blue City* (1986), voiced Hot Rod / Rodimus Prime in the animated film *The Transformers: The Movie* (1986), and had lead roles in *From the Hip* (1987) and *Relentless* (1989). For his portrayal of Joe Hunt in the biographical television miniseries *Billionaire Boys Club* (1987), Nelson was nominated for a Golden Globe Award for Best Actor – Miniseries or Television Film.

In the 1990s, Nelson starred in the films *New Jack City* (1991), *Airheads* (1994), *Steel* (1997), and *Light It Up* (1999). He experienced a career resurgence with a main role as Jack Richmond on the NBC sitcom *Suddenly Susan* (1996–1999).

During the 2000s and 2010s, Nelson appeared in a string of television and direct-to-video films. He starred in the film *The Boondock Saints II: All Saints Day* (2009) and portrayed Ryan Hunt, the father of Joe Hunt, in a starring role in *Billionaire Boys Club* (2018). Nelson reprised his voice role as Hot Rod / Rodimus Prime in the animated web series *Transformers: Titans Return* (2017–2018).

John Hughes (filmmaker)

John Wilden Hughes Jr. (February 18, 1950 – August 6, 2009) was an American filmmaker and producer. He is best known for writing, producing, and directing such films as *Sixteen Candles*, *The Breakfast Club*, *Weird Science*, *Ferris Bueller's Day Off*, *Planes, Trains and Automobiles*, and *Uncle Buck*, and writing *Pretty in Pink* and *Home Alone*.

Most of Hughes's works were set in Chicago. His films often combine slapstick comedy with heartfelt moments. Actors whose careers Hughes helped launch include John Candy, Molly Ringwald, Matthew Broderick, Anthony Michael Hall, and Macaulay Culkin. Hughes has since been considered an icon defining the 1980s with his coming-of-age stories, capturing the teenage experience and shaping the teen movie genre.

Breakfast with Scot is a 2007 Canadian comedy film. It is adapted from the 1999 novel by Tufts University professor Michael Downing.

The screenplay was adapted by Sean Reycraft from the book by Michael Downing, and the film was directed by Laurie Lynd. The film attracted significant press attention in 2006, when the National Hockey League and the Toronto Maple Leafs announced that they had approved the use of the team's logo and uniforms in the film. *Breakfast with Scot* was the first gay-themed film ever to receive this type of approval from a professional sports league.

In early 2007, several months before the film's release, an excerpt was screened at Toronto's Inside Out Film and Video Festival as an advance preview, alongside Lynd's earlier short films *RSVP* and *The Fairy Who Didn't Want to Be a Fairy Anymore*.

Shephard was a main presenter on the now defunct breakfast programme GMTV and co-hosted the ITV breakfast show *Good Morning Britain* alongside Susanna Reid and Kate Garraway from 2014 until 2024. He has also hosted shows such as *The Krypton Factor* (2009–2010), *Tipping Point* (2012–present) and *Ninja Warrior UK* (2015–2019, 2022).

In 2012, along with Helen Skelton, he welcomed the athletes of the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games to Trafalgar Square as part of their homecoming parade.

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
